

Composer Leslie Adams Joins Spring ASOC Visitors



ATIONALLY renowned composer
Leslie Adams '55, from Cleveland,
was guest speaker April 17 in a program sponsored
by Afrikan Heri-

tage House. Last year Leslie completed three new works and oversaw two premieres and eight performances of his work, including Night Song for flute and

harp at New York's Carnegie Hall, and Christmus Lullaby, performed by the Cleveland Orchestra. Selections from his new opera, Blake, were performed this March by soprano Martina Arroyo and the Royal Ethiopian Philharmonic Orchestra at a command performance for the emperor and empress of Ethiopia in Constitution Hall in Washington, D.C. He has received fellowships from the Yaddo artist colony and the National Endowment for the Arts. Leslie received his Mus.B. degree in music education from Oberlin and the Ph.D. degree in music from Ohio State University. Excerpts of the music from Blake are heard on
